Facts on Disorders of the Corpus Callosum

- DCC is a brain malformation.
- The Corpus Callosum is a major pathway that links the two hemispheres together.
- Affects 1 in 3000 people.
- It is usually diagnosed via an MRI.
- The effects are variable from mild to severe developmental delay.
- Other brain conditions can also be present.



- DCC is often discovered at the 20 week routine scan.
- Professionals cannot predict the outcomes.
- Genetic counselling can be offered by the professionals.



Facts on Aicardi Syndrome

- Aicardi is a rare syndrome girls are mostly affected & rarely are boys.
- Visual impairments, DCC and learning difficulties are common.
- Corpal has a dedicated Aicardi contact.
